

## **BOARD OF TRUSTEES NEWS**

The Board of Trustees would like to take this opportunity to thank parents and staff for their contributions over the past year in supporting our students. A special thank you goes to the Yearbook Committee for their excellent celebration of 2009. It continues to be a great record of life at Melville.

### ***Elections***

We would like to encourage parents to make themselves available for the elections next year so that you can help support and shape the school's future direction.

### ***New Chairman***

It was with regret that **Chairman, Guss Wilkinson** stood down from this position after 30 months, due to work pressures. **Deputy Chairman, Chris Baker**, has willingly assumed this role until the new elections next year. We would like to thank Guss for his contribution to the Board in this role.

### ***Property***

Work is underway with finalising the plans for the Administration Block, Hall and entrance area upgrades. Work will get underway in March and will result in some significant dislocation. We will appreciate your support in this area.

### ***Revised Curriculum***

While we have been working hard on finalising the school's charter and biennial plan, staff has been spending considerable time and effort in preparing for the implementation of the revised New Zealand Curriculum. Together we will create a powerful document to help shape our future activity.

The teachers have developed a range of strategies, resources and pilot activities in their classrooms, including inquiry learning, student profiles and the use of web based learning tools like **KnowledgeNet**. We are proud of the achievements of our staff in this area, especially the way they are utilising this opportunity to review the way they facilitate learning and not just tweaking current systems.

### ***Shortened days***

The Board has approved staff undertaking regular professional development through shortened days to support the implementation of the revised curriculum. On Wednesdays, each period, interval and lunchtime will be shortened by five minutes with school finishing **at 2.30pm**. The Board will approve the staff development programme outline at its February meeting. At a time when there are additional responsibilities being placed on schools and teachers, the Board believes that by supporting this initiative we will be able to both recognise this effort and ensure that there is quality time available to begin to carry out the key aspects expected of the school. There will be some support and supervision available for students after 2.30 pm in the Glenice Gallagher Library.

## BOARD OF TRUSTEES ELECTIONS

All New Zealand's state and state-integrated schools have a Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees is the Crown entity responsible for the governance and the control of the management of the school. The Board is the employer of all staff in the school, is responsible for setting the school's strategic direction in consultation with parents, staff and students, and ensuring that its school provides a safe environment and quality education for all its students. Boards are also responsible for overseeing the management of personnel, curriculum, property, finance and administration. Trustees are elected by the parent community and our next election is in Term 1 2010. Staff elect their own representative, and in our school, students elect a student representative too. Our student representative is Anna Strong and her term continues until September next year. The principal is also a member of the Board. Further information will be distributed early in the new year.

We are all disappointed about the decision to close CLC but the removal of funding gave the Board of Trustees no choice. On behalf of the staff and the broader community, I would like to wish Neil and Diane all the very best for the future.

## REVISION OF TUTOR STRUCTURE - YEAR GROUP TUTORS

Melville High School has a team of staff that supports the Pastoral Care of our students. This team includes: Senior Leadership Team, Deans, Guidance, Director of Learning Initiatives, School Chaplain and Campus Constable. We have begun to implement a new structure of horizontal Tutor Groups for 2010 in an attempt to support our initiatives to improve student attendance and junior student behaviour. Embedded in this new structure are a series of organisational changes, key outcomes and targets to support its implementation.

As a result, students will be grouped for tutor (daily form period) in horizontal year groups. The keys goals for tutor are **Attendance**, **Relationships** and **Communication (ARC)**. To achieve at school, attendance and application are essential. **ARC** will therefore become the catch cry of the Pastoral Care team for 2010.

The new structure is as follows:

There will be provision throughout each term of structured periods where senior students undertake activities with a specific tutor as part of the peer support programme. The house system will remain and be led by staff other than the deans.

While it will be sad that we have had to break up the vertical student groups, including the many positive relationships developed over time, new tutors will follow through with their students. Meeting all the outcomes with a wide range of students, with each level having its own needs and support, was a challenge for tutors. By focusing on each year level, we anticipate being able to support our staff to meet these expectations in a more systematic and productive manner.

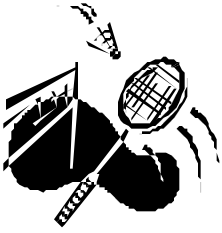

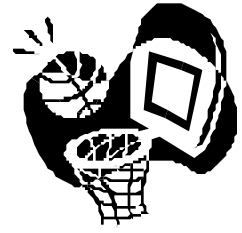

## CRICKET

The 1<sup>st</sup> XI cricket game against Te Aroha was another case of lost opportunity. Batting first, Melville scored over 200 for the first time, reaching 208 in the 49<sup>th</sup> over. The main contributor was **Ben** with 90 runs. **Harry** was next top scorer with 20. Ben shared a last wicket partnership with **Jordan** of 66. Te Aroha was steady in their run chase; their opening partnership was 93 and they got the required runs for the loss of 6 wickets with 3 overs to spare. The best Melville bowler was **James W**, taking 2/16.

The highlight for the term was a victory over HBHS Emerging players. Batting first, HBHS were all out for 139. **James** was the best of the Melville attack, taking 4/16 in 6 overs. **James** provided the backbone for the run chase, scoring 63 not out. Melville got to 140 with the loss of only 4 wickets. Unfortunately, this was the peak for the term and the team suffered losses against Te Awamutu and the return match against HBHS Emerging. The team has put together some solid performances for their first year at the top level. They will only be losing one player next year so they have a very solid foundation to build from. The top run scorer for the term was **James** and the top wicket taker **Jordan**.

## RUGBY LEAGUE

For the first time in recent memory, Melville High entered a Rugby League team in a one day tournament held at Resthills Park. Many of the boys had not played league before but were very keen to give it a go. They had regular trainings for three weeks before the tournament under the watchful eye of Year 13 student, **Marley** and a number of assistants. A lot of time went into their training and it was very pleasing to see the commitment. On the day, they had four games against teams from as far away as Tokoroa

## MELVILLE HIGH CULINARY TEAM

We hired a van to take everything to Rotovegas, arrived on time and promptly had a falling out with the judges over the cold desserts – so we got disqualified! We did well on the stove though and were awarded the only gold of the competitions and two silvers!

Regarding the marking process, all competitors are given 100 marks to begin with and then marks are deducted for mistakes, time penalties, etc. It is not uncommon to have no golds, a couple of silvers and a few bronze medals in a class (even sometimes no medals at all), so being awarded a gold medal was a very meritorious achievement in itself.
