HABITAT FOR HUMANITY BIG BUILD CHAMPIONS 2013

This year, students from Melville High's senior Hard Materials Technology classes have been involved with several community based projects in conjunction with **Habitat for Humanity** (an international not-for-profit organisation whose goal is to eliminate sub-standard housing and homelessness). The students have undertaken various renovation jobs and most recently a new house build. The 'Hamilton Big Build Challenge' involved the construction of a four bedroom house for a specially selected family, on site in Enderley. The students worked for two days and were required to complete all aspects of the construction with the qualified builders on hand. Three other schools were also involved in the challenge which revolved around gaining points for safe working practices, presentation, attitude and effort. At the end of the challenge, Melville High School was declared the convincing winners and was awarded the prize of a flat screen television.

Being involved with Habitat for Humanity has produced several benefits for both the school and the students. Firstly, it has meant that the students have been exposed to authentic experiences. They have worked



alongside qualified trades men and women, gathering knowledge and applying it. The students have also learnt the value of giving service to others. This epitomises the school's ethos "**To Serve and To Work**", and leads well towards achieving better relationships and more involvement with our community. I am extremely proud of all the students who took part. Not only did they represent the school well, but they also represented themselves in a way that drew praise from everyone involved. Looking ahead we have more projects lined up for next year, this time focusing on the greater Melville area, working with and supporting low income households and the elderly.

LITERACY AND NUMERACY CALLBACK

Several parents of senior students have been informed that their children are required to attend school after the seniors are released for study leave to ensure they have further opportunities to gain the prescribed Literacy and Numeracy credits.

As you may be aware, there are a minimum number of literacy (reading, writing, speaking) and numeracy credits that students must have achieved before they can get NCEA Level 1 and 2 regardless of the number of credits they have achieved.

I am requiring students who have yet to gain their 10 Literacy and 10 Numeracy credits to attend school from November 11th to work with teaching staff and support staff until they have completed these credits.

School does not officially end until 6 December and we hope that with up to an additional week's focused effort, it will make a significant difference for these students.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Dave McNulty, Lester Silver, Kathleen Christian and Donna Wilson who have been working with students to support this strategy.

I thank families for their support in this matter. A letter informing families of this situation will be sent out this week.

FOOD STUDIES

The Level 3 Food Studies class was fortunate again to have Darren Mordecai, the Sealord National Sales Manager come to two of their classes this week. Darren spent the first session with the Year 13 students demonstrating two quick and easy dishes that can be made from tinned seafood. The first dish was crab cakes made from tinned crabmeat. The second dish from tinned tuna was a Smoked Tuna and Roasted vegetable Moroccan salad. While demonstrating the two dishes, Darren talked to the students about seafood, different kinds and types of fish and commercial fishing techniques. Darren is a chef by trade. He talked about training and working as a chef in the New Zealand Air force and how chefing as a career has taken him many places and into many different jobs. While he is not a chef now, the training and experience he gained while with the New Zealand Defence Force has been invaluable. He talked about why he chose to become a chef and the reasons for changing his career over the years. In the second session, the students prepared both the tuna and crabmeat dishes. They were not only impressed by how good the dishes tasted but how quick, simple and cheap the Sealord fish products were to use to create an impressive looking dish.

Smart Water starts with you!
Here's what you can do!

We all love the summer sun, the beaches and the long nights but summer also brings with it some pressure on our water resources. Councils, along with 100 other river users, have resource consents to take water from the Waikato River. This consent determines how we use the water and how much water we can take. Water supply, even if it is from a spring or bore despite what many think, is not unlimited and during summer months when demand for water is at its peak we need to make sure we use it wisely. This is a reminder to families that Smart Water starts with YOU! Here are some simple and easy things you can do that will make a big difference.

1. Be a leak detective! Check all hoses, connectors, and taps regularly for leaks and save up to 500 litres a day
2. Wash your pets outdoors, in an area of your lawn that needs water.
3. When cleaning out fish tanks, give the nutrient-rich water to your non-edible plants.
4. Shorten your shower by a minute or two and you'll save up to 570 litres a month.
5. Keep a jug of drinking water in the fridge instead of running the tap. This way, every drop goes down you and not the drain.

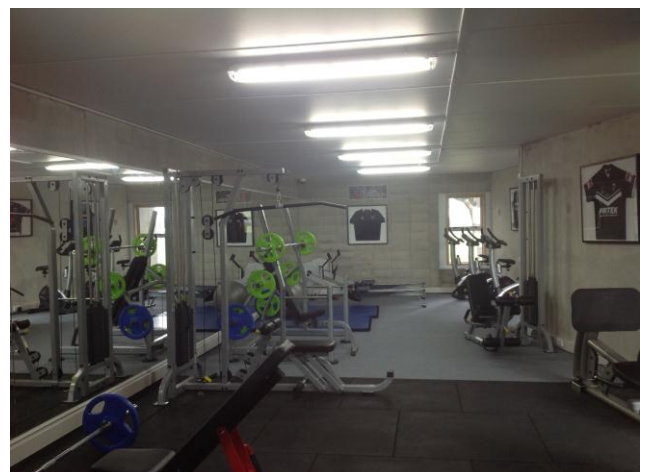
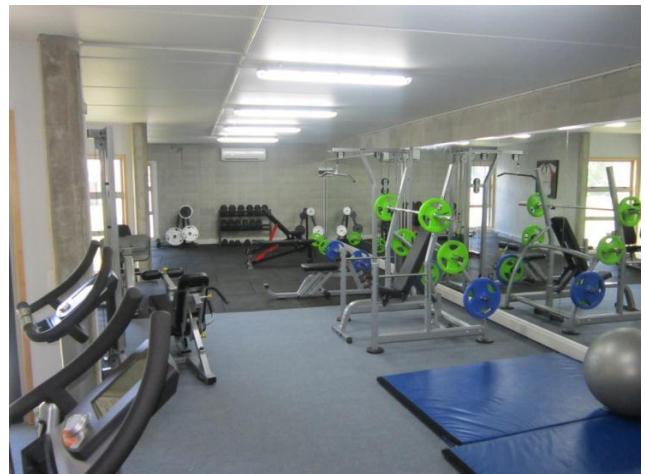
The John Gallagher Fitness Centre is located immediately below the Glenice Gallagher Library.

Clay Target Shooting Success

In mid-August, **Joshua** (pictured below) competed at the New Zealand Open Sporting Clay Grand-Prix where he was placed first Junior (Junior is classed as under 21, so he is doing well at 14).



Later in August, the North Island North Zone Sporting shoot was held at the Waikato Clay Target Club and again Josh finished first junior.

Over the weekend 28-30 September, the Waikato Clay Target Club held the North Island and New Zealand Secondary Schools Shoot. There were over 280 students competing from all over New Zealand. Unfortunately Melville High only had one student competing, Josh. After really tricky conditions on the Saturday and Sunday (rain and very strong winds), Josh shot well but not quite well enough to qualify for any finals. On the Monday, he shot extremely well achieving 23/25 in the North Island Skeet Champs. This put him into a shoot off for 3rd in the North Island's with five other boys, three from Waitaki Boys' High and two from Palmerston Boys' High. Josh was first shooter up (in the shoot off, it is sudden death- miss and you are out) and cleared the first stand of 4 targets. After the first stand there were still 5 in the shoot off. Second stand of 4 targets Josh again cleared this, losing 2 more competitors. Onto the final Stand with 3 still in it, Josh cleared the stand with the last 2 boys from Waitaki both dropping out. Finishing 3rd in the North Island when he is 14 years old and competing against boys and girls up to Year 13 is a great result.

This goes along with his 3rd Junior at the New Zealand Sporting Clay Champs in Wanganui in February; it has been a great year and hopefully we will see some more awesome results in 2014.

The major shoot in mid-November will be the last for the year. This is the National Compak Champs in Dargaville. This shoot has several Australian Juniors shooting so we will have a good gauge on where he is.

At present, Josh is second on the New Zealand Junior Sporting Teams table where the top three juniors will have a chance to compete in New Caledonia in April 2014.
